<b>4 day events</b>	Flower Festival	Godfrey Broster has confirmed that over the full four day period there will be a Village Flower Festival in All Saints. Gill Wells has been approached and it is hoped that many if not all of the clubs and societies will sponsor a window or arrangement. Deborah Phillips wondered if it might be possible for arrangements to be in St Michael's as well. Kelvin Speirs to talk to Godfrey to progress the scope.		
	Video/photography of the whole event	Carole and Paul Nicholson may be able to take still photographs during part of the events. Carole will ask Raymond Young if he would like to take some video footage. Agreed that there may be other people in the village willing to help with this as well. It was thought that the end product could be sold as DVDs and perhaps also lodged on a village website.		
	Planting of a Jubilee Tree(s)	There is a national Jubilee programme for tree planting in communities being managed by <b>The CFOP &amp; Landscape-UK</b> (Carbon Footprint Offsetting Partnership of wholesale forestry nurseries and businesses nationwide). It was felt that it would be good if Plumpton could be part of this initiative. It was thought that the Village Green was the most suitable place; Kathy Baker undertook to seek Parish Council support. The Plumpton Wildlife & Habitat Group and the Horticultural Society are to be asked if they would like to take ownership of this project.		
	Souvenirs	Various ideas are being looked at; eg each child in the village being presented with a mug by the PC with others for sale; it was agreed to look at this further once it was known how much money may be available. There is an authorised generic logo for the Jubilee which can be used in conjunction with a localised graphic. Kathy Baker is going to discuss with the Head of Wine at Plumpton College whether the Collage would be prepared to offer a 'Jubilee wine'. Godfrey Broster has also been making enquiries into producing a special commemorative bottle beer. Further details are to be worked out in the New Year. It has to be remembered to that to give one bottle to each household would cost in the region of £1000.		
	Recipe Book	Jo Dubber is leading on this project. Reg Lanaway and Glenda Bowden are assisting. It is hoped that clubs and societies will be willing to submit favourite recipes. PPTFA have already expressed support.		
	Brochure for Event	Kathy Baker has heard from 15 local businesses that have indicated that they may be interested in sponsoring the cost of this. Kathy is also meeting with LDC that has indicated that it may be interested in helping.

<b>One day events</b>	<b>Afternoon</b> Launch of 'Plumpton History Story'	<p>A number of projects emerging from Plumpton Ancient &amp; Modern:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Picture book of Pictorial History of Plumpton based on Ken Beard's photographs – this is being worked on by Ken with Carole and Paul Nicholson</li> <li>b) A Hidden Histories oral history project is being undertaken by about 12 volunteers in conjunction with the University of Sussex. The intention is to have 10-12 oral recordings available by the Jubilee with further interviews continuing after the celebrations. Kathy Baker is the PC representative.</li> <li>c) Jeanie Muddle had mentioned that she may be able to produce a reprint of the Scarpfoot Parish. Carole Nicholson to discuss with Jeanie whether this is being progressed for the Jubilee.</li> <li>d) Jane Shepherd is reviewing whether there is appetite for the production of a 'Children's View of Plumpton'</li> <li>e) Very early stage discussions have taken place between Kathy Baker and Godfrey Broster about the concept of a Plumpton museum being housed at St Michael's church – further discussions are being pursued as to what may be involved and how the PCC can help.</li> <li>f) Thought that an updated map of the village would be good – is there anyone interested in 'owning' this project?</li> <li>g) It is hoped that if some or all of the above can be achieved for the Jubilee further initiatives such as a detailed history book of the village may be worked on after the main event.</li> </ul>
